
FOREWORD | CHAIRMAN

#### **1** Lascaris War Room

The Lascaris War Rooms formed part of the War Headquarters opened in 1940 under the Upper Barrakka Gardens, Valletta. They offered a secure place from where war operations could be conducted by all three services. The war rooms are located deep in the rock under St. Peter and St. Paul Bastion which forms part of the defences of Valletta built by the Knights of St. John in 1566. Entrance is from two points via the steps in Battery Street or the ramp at Manwel Dimech Avenue through Herbert Ganado Gardens. Given the nature of the building, only group visits of no more than 30 will be allowed starting every half an hour.





### Sanctuary Basilica of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Old Theatre Street

The Carmelite priests moved to the new city of Valletta in 1570. The first church dedicated to our Lady of Mount Carmel was designed by the famous Maltese architect Gilormu Cassar. This Church served as the fist parish of the new capital between 1570 and 1582.

As Malta's most hallowed theatre, no artistic night in the capital would be complete without entertainment provided on the stage of the Manoel Theatre. During Notte Bianca the Manoel will open its doors wide to the public with a special one-night only variety of theatre and music.

Dutch pianist Mike del Ferro will be giving no less than three musical sets during the night. As a highly sought-after composer, pianist and arranger who writes and performs in an impressive array of musical genres, He will be performing a versatile programme of his own compositions inspired by operatic themes, jazz standards and other favorites.

He has managed to combine elements of the revered canons of Western music interspersed with the audacity of Jazz improvisation, and paying tribute to the ancient structures of Asian, South American and African traditional music.

The Manoel Theatre will also be presenting a tribute drama performance II-Jien u lil hinn Minnu, which is a dramatisation of the poem of the same by the much-loved Maltese poet, writer and ecclesiastical figure Dun Karm Psaila. II-Jien u lil hinn Minnu is considered to be a piece of literary work that sets Dun Karm apart in the local literary scene. The poem was written between 1936 and 1937, and therefore 2012 marks the 75th anniversary of this Maltese poetic milestone. This theatre performance is under the direction of Josette Ciappara, and features the acting talents of Anthony Ellulu, Stefan Farrugia, Rosita Lautier, Rebecca Bezzina, Angele Cristina and Lenia Gatt.

Finally the Manoel will be staging a reproduction of the most memorable musical showdown in history: Mozart vs. Salieri. Following its success in the UK earlier this year under the artistic & musical direction of lan Peter Bugeja, this opera double-bill makes an appearance at Teatru Manoel for this year's Notte Bianca.

The Hulda Festival is an innovative platform that aims to build bridges between sciences, arts and daily life. The project takes its name from M/S Hulda, a two-mast Baltic schooner built in 1905 at Sjötorp shipyard in Sweden, acquired in 1965 by Turkish-Swedish artist İlhan Koman, who lived there with his family until his death in 1986. The schooner is classified as a Swedish historical monument, and was recently renovated and converted into a sailing cultural centre, starting its journey from Sweden to the Mediterranean. In August of this year, Hulda set sail for its second journey around the Mediterranean Sea, heading to Valletta after

Fethiye, Turkey and Amfilochia, Greece. In her second journey M/S Hulda is hosting artists, musicians and writers from the European countries and Turkey. While an exhibition showing the works of the resident artists are presented on Hulda, artistic workshops related to issues addressing daily life are organized for the public, inviting the participants to create works drawing inspiration and materials from their natural and urban environment and to discuss their expectations from cultural institutions and events. In a rapidly transforming reality, the participants are prompted to renegotiate their notions of artistic activities and art itself, making the most of their personal experiences. Notte Bianca patrons are invited to come aboard and let their imaginations sail the seas of multicultural art pieces and ideas.

while the surprisingly many animal forms carved in the stone and marble of the capital's walls. Each one has its own story and meaning.

#### THE CULT OF ST PAUL IN VALLETTA

With the construction of the City of Valletta, also came the building of many diverse churches. One of these Valletta churches built was il-Kolleġġjata tan-Nawfraġju ta' San Pawl, which was built thanks to the monetary collections of the Mdina Cathedral. Over the years there were many other architectural expressions that gave evidence to the cult of St Paul in Valletta. This tour will guide you around some of the many buildings and representations dedicated to this much-loved saint.

#### **VALLETTA DURING WWII**

Valletta was heavily bombed by enemy attacks during World War II, along with every other populated area around the Grand Harbour. Discover the incidents, personages and memories that fashioned Valletta's unique history during these war times.

Many monuments commemorating important events and people beautifully decorate the streets and gardens of Valletta. This guided walk will uncover the full details of these memories enclosed in stones as well as discuss the artists that fashioned them.

Imagine passing by the National Library in Valletta and seeing a giant brain hanging in between its arches. Imagine watching fivefoot tall fruit flies sitting on benches, sipping coffee, or playing the guitar. Imagine an old Maltese bus built as a circle. If you ever thought science was boring then get ready for Science in the City to change your mind.

Running from the 28th of September till the 28th of October, Science in the City is a festival placing researchers on centre stage by filling Valletta with science-inspired art, music, theatre, dance and installations. During Notte Bianca, Science in the City will be presenting a host of weird and wonderful events.

St. James Cavalier there will be showing a science and art exhibition called Why?, which sees local scientists and artist collaborating on an interactive exhibit aimed for families. The cinema room will be screening extracts of Isabella Rossellini's critically acclaimed and provocative online series Green Porno. The series features Rossellini as she acts out the reproductive habits of marine animals and insects, scientifically accurate yet extremely entertaining.

The St James theatre will run plays including the acclaimed QED, a play about a day in the life of the eccentric Nobel Prize winner Richard Feynman. This scientist wrote several novels, took part in the Manhattan project, and died of cancer in 1988, aged sixty-nine. And if you thought that was all, well there is also a kid's area, a film festival, science cafes, and more.



The upper part of Merchant's Street will house a SciBar; a science themed bar with music that will give patrons a unique opportunity to eat and drink whilst being surrounded by giant fruit flies.

Furthermore there will be crazy and insightful science related events happening at the Auberge d'Italie, Palazzo Parisio, Strait Street, and St. George's Square.











During Notte Bianca the streets of Valletta are flooded by musicians, actors, dancers and a horde of other artistic souls who will be lighting-up pockets of the city with their unique talents, skills and traditions.

The Mithras Sword Club will be giving displays and demonstrations of Historical Fencing. The methods and principles used by Mithras are the traditional techniques of single combat that are used for self-defence or in the context of a duel. This is a unique opportunity to acquaint yourself with a time-honoured sport that is still as exciting and thrilling as it ever was.

Watch out for the daring and skilful Fire Dragon performers who will be setting the city ablaze with their fiery antics. They will be showcasing their fire juggling, spinning and twirling skills, as well as body burning and other light-based performances. Just make sure you don't get too close.

Other groups and societies, such as the Military & Hospitallier of St Lazarus, will also be present during the night and will happy to talk to patrons and introduce them to the principles and functions of their associations.



No feast or celebration on our islands would be complete without those traditions and customs that make Malta and the Maltese such a unique culture around the globe. And while Notte Bianca prides itself on showcasing the very best of the contemporary and innovative, it still holds a special place in its festivities to celebrate Malta's cultural heritage.

The Tal-Fuklar Folk Group will be giving musical recitals of traditional Maltese ghanjiet, lullabies and songs all nightlong. The group, which is made up of some 8 musicians, will be playing piano-accordions, guitars, tambourines as well as traditional local instruments such as the rubbaba or żafżafa. The group has also become well known for its elaborately detailed folk costumes, including the ghonnella, as well as for their craftsmanship with bizzilla (lace making), ganutell, macramé and wool-weaving.

The Paul Curmi Dance Group will be performing Maltese folklore dancing along to music composed by Paul Curmi himself. The ensemble's pieces are a musical embodiment of the humble fishermen's chores, the lively village festa celebrations, the bygone nobility of Mdina's aristocracy, and the leisurely paces of the spouses and guests at the traditional Maltese weddings.

Nearby there will also by ghana performances by Salvu Tanti in various folkloristic forms, such as the Ghana Spirtu Pront, Daqq tal-Prejjem, and Makjetti, not to mention a variety of delicious local food kiosks and must-see crafts stalls.

So come and experience all that is truly Maltese at a revived and motley Independence Square. No matter what time you drop by, there is sure to be something that will tickle your fancy.


